3 Matters Arising

- Possibility of a Defibrillator in the village - ongoing investigation - Cllr N Howard reported that most people in the village are in favour of the idea. Funding is available but there is an ongoing cost. A small team of volunteers is needed with a project leader to follow up on all the information that Cllr Howard has already collected. Cllrs will talk to other villagers to see if they can find anyone to take this on.
- Jubilee Field Wall, section damaged by tree roots near new gates will be repaired within next two weeks. The bill will be covered by the kind donation from the coffee morning earlier this year with the balance from the amenity fields own funds.
- Final arrangements for the Twinning Association Coffee morning tomorrow were made..

4 County & District Councillors

C. Cllr Jill Haynes reported that a Housing Association scheme on Poundbury for 60 supported living flats with a resident warden and carers on call will be discussed by cabinet on Weds. Roadworks on the Maiden Newton road at present are pushing extra traffic through Evershot. There is a big consultation going on at present about the local government reorganisation, trying to get people involved. It can be found online at the "Dorset for You" website.
Cllr Tim Yarker reported that the Dorchester centre development has 3 different proposals on the table and investigations are under way as to the viability of each of them. There is also a review of the site's archaeology. Park and Ride is suspended at the moment due to lack of use.
Cllr Fred Horsington reported that the plans for the prison site was not refused because of the lack of affordable housing but because the cell block changes just inside the gates would have been too overbearing on existing local houses. There is a lot of work going on behind the scenes towards the Combined Authority.
