

BRADFORD PEVERELL ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Held in the Village Hall on Thursday July 5th, 2018

2 Minutes of Parish Council meeting held on Thursday May 3rd, 2018
Proposed by Cllr S. Denning, Seconded by Cllr N. Howard

3 Matters Arising -

(a) Storage of and access to the Pump - Sue Cumming has offered to store the pump in an outdoor building at Mill House. As this location is central and easily accessible the suggestion was proposed by Cllr Denning and seconded by Cllr Cooper. Carried unanimously.

4 County and District Cllrs Reports -

D. Cllr Fred Horsington gave a brief report on the Boundary Commission's recent consultation email showing revised wards for the County. 82 Councillors will represent these wards on the new council.

C.Cllr Jill Haynes sent an email report which was read by the chairman. The Unitary Authority has been given the go-ahead and the first meeting of the Shadow Authority was attended by councillors of all the existing authorities. Hillary Cox was elected Chairman, the constitution was agreed and Matt Prosser was appointed as interim chief executive. Also appointed were the chief financial officer and the monitoring officer. It was agreed to advertise for the substantive role of Chief Executive for the new council. The shadow executive committee have also met and made various appointments, Rebecca Knox was elected as leader. The budget for 2019-2020 needs to be agreed this autumn merging all the various councils services. In Adult Social Care alone an additional £9M is needed to balance the budget and the Ofsted reports for secondary schools was not good but most of them are now Academies where the responsibility is with the governors and Head teachers. County are looking to provide a new special school at Monkton Park and are hoping to build two new care villages in Wareham and Bridport.

5 Use of Jubilee Field for Village Event -

A village picnic is planned for Sat July 14th from 2 - 6pm, with live music and fun games for children and families. There will be no charges but voluntary donations will be collected for village amenity repairs and maintenance. All councillors present were in favour of there being no charge for the use of the field as it is a village event.

6 Correspondence -

- West Dorset, Weymouth & Portland Local Plan [Review Preferred Options](#) draft document. Cllr P Cooper [outlined that the area marked as DOR 15, listed as Land North of Dorchester, included Lower Burton, Higher Burton, Frome Whitfield, Coker's Frome, and Higher Kingston Farm. The proposal is to develop this land with 3,500 new homes, employment land, additional school provision, and a new road link between the A35 and A37 via B3147. The area marked DOR 16, listed as Land to the West of Charminster proposes 320 new homes. Both proposals will be subjected to further consultation from mid August for 8 weeks. BPPC Councillors expressed the view that the necessary infrastructure \(esp schools\) will need to be in place before building starts. WDDC Councillors advised the Local Plan should provide areas for growth and expansion over a long period of time and should prevent speculative development. The area marked as D 6 on the Bradford Peverell side of the by-pass has now been removed from the proposed development list.](#)

8 Officer's Reports -

- Village Maintenance Cllr N Howard rang Highways about the overgrown banks on Poundbury Lane and the obscured sight lines on the A 37 central reservations.
- Footpaths and Rights of Way Cllr Verner-Jeffries - A Public Path diversion order for parts of Bridleway 15 has been circulated. The anti-slip mesh on the footbridge over the river keeps breaking up in places but does get repaired, however, it may be necessary to replace the entire length at some point soon.
